

Becoming a Technical Official



Having volunteers who are willing to get involved with officiating is an integral part of any strong and successful swimming club; the sport of swimming cannot function without officials! If you are a busy person who is keen to support swimming, then get involved! The following steps will help get you qualified and competent:

1. Become a financial member of your local swimming club. This will mean that you, and the club, are covered by insurance while you are carrying out any officiating duties.
2. Obtain a free NSW Working with Children Check by applying [here](#). If you are in the ACT, apply for a Working with Vulnerable People Check [here](#).
3. Once you receive clearance, be sure to forward your WWCC/WWVP number and date of birth onto both your local club committee and *Area Technical Swimming Committee Coordinator* (ATSCC – if you are unsure who this is please check [this page](#) on our website to find out).
4. Complete the *Community Officiating General Principles* and *Introduction to Officiating* [here](#).
5. Begin your online training modules through the [Swimming NSW Training Website](#). We recommend beginning with the following modules as they are suitable for new officials looking to assist with club nights and club meets.
